ORDER SUSTAINING OBJECTION OF MISSISSIPPI PHOSPHATES CORPORATION TO PROOF OF CLAIM OF WILLIE JAMES BURNS - CLAIM NO. 54²

[Dkt. ## 1235, 1607]

This matter came before the Court on the *Objection of Mississippi Phosphates*Corporation to Proof of Claim of Willie James Burns - Claim No. 54 [Dkt. # 1235] (the "Objection")³ filed by Mississippi Phosphates Corporation, et al., the Debtors and

Debtors-in-possession herein, by and through their attorneys to request that the Court enter an Order disallowing the Claim for severance pay and related benefits, and the *Response* filed by Willie James Burns [Dkt. # 1607] (the "*Response*"). Willie James Burns did not appear, either in person or by counsel, at the hearing on the Objection and the Response. Having considered the Objection and the Response, the Court finds that the Objection is well-taken and should be sustained.

The Court further finds as follows:

- 1. This Court has jurisdiction over this Objection and Response pursuant to 28 U.S.C. §§ 157 and 1334. Venue is proper pursuant to 28 U.S.C. §§ 1408 and 1409. This is a core proceeding under 28 U.S.C. § 157(b)(2)(A) & (B).
- 2. The bases for the relief sought by the Debtor in the Objection is pursuant to 11 U.S.C. § 101 et seq. (the "*Bankruptcy Code*"), and specifically 11 U.S.C. §§ 102, 105, and 502, Rule 3007 of the Federal Rules of Bankruptcy Procedure (the "*Bankruptcy Rules*"), and Miss. Bankr. L.R. 3007-1.

IT IS, THEREFORE, ORDERED that the Objection is sustained.

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED that the Claim shall be disallowed and expunged.

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED that the Court shall retain jurisdiction with respect to any matters, claims, rights or disputes arising from or related to the implementation of this Order.
