## AGREED ORDER GRANTING MOTION FOR RELIEF FROM STAY

[Dkt. ## 1457, 1615, 1616, 1618, 1650]

This matter came on for consideration by the Court on the *Motion for Relief from Stay* [Dkt. # 1618] (the "*Stay Motion*") filed by Victor Lemon (the "*Claimant*") and the *Response of the Debtors to Motion for Relief from Stay* [Dkt. # 1650] (the "*Response*") filed by Mississippi Phosphates Corporation, *et al.*, the Debtors and debtors-in-possession herein (the "*Debtors*"), by and through their attorneys. After considering the foregoing, the Court finds the Stay Motion should be granted.

IT IS, THEREFORE, ORDERED that, in accordance with and pursuant to that certain Agreed Order Granting Motion of the Debtors to Modify the Automatic Stay as to Workers' Compensation Claims [Dkt. # 1690] (the "Insurance Order"), the Stay Motion is granted and that the Claimant may prosecute his claim(s) under the Mississippi Workers' Compensation Laws against the Debtors for the purpose of establishing the Debtors' obligations and/or liability to the Claimant solely for the purpose of enforcing such obligations or liability against and/or in connection with the applicable Insurance Policies, but not against the bankruptcy estates.

TT IS FURTHER ORDERED that the Omnibus Objection of Mississippi Phosphates Corporation Pursuant to 11 U.S.C. § 502, Fed. R. Bankr. P. 3007 and 9014 and Miss. Bankr. 3007-1 to Certain Non-Complying Claims [Dkt. # 1457] and the Response to Omnibus Objection of Mississippi Phosphates Corporation Pursuant to 11 U.S.C. § 502, Fed. R. Bankr. P. 3007 and 9014 and Miss. Bankr. 3007-1 to Certain Non-Complying Claims [Dkt. # 1615] (the "Claims Objection") and the Response to Omnibus Objection of Mississippi Phosphates Corporation Pursuant to 11 U.S.C. § 502, Fed. R. Bankr. P. 3007 and 9014 and Miss. Bankr. 3007-1 to Certain Non-Complying Claims [Dkt. # 1616] (the "Responses") are hereby resolved to allow Claimant and Jerry Don Scudder, Jr. to prosecute their respective claims(s) under the Mississippi Workers' Compensation Laws against the Debtors for the purpose of establishing the Debtors' obligations and/or liability to the Claimant and Jerry Don Scudder, Jr. solely for the purpose of enforcing such obligations or liability against and/or in connection with the applicable Insurance Policies in accordance with the Insurance Order, but to disallow and expunge the respective claims of Claimant [Claim No. 343] and Jerry Don Scudder, Jr. [Claim No. 206] against the bankruptcy estates.

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED that the entry of this Order shall not modify or impair the

rights of any Insurer with respect to any Insurance Policies, any claims under any Insurance

Policies, the Insurance Order or any prior order of this Court relating to any Insurer or the

Insurance Policies, which rights remain expressly preserved and that this Order shall not be a

construed as a waiver of any terms, conditions, exclusions or other provisions to any Insurance

Policies, including the right to assert defenses to any claims for coverage if such action is

warranted.

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED that with respect to all other insurance policies (other

than the Insurance Policies), the automatic stay shall remain in full force and effect until further

order of the Court.
