**ORDER GRANTING RELIEF FROM THE AUTOMATIC STAY
IMPOSED BY 11 U.S.C §362**

This cause coming on for hearing upon the Motion For Relief from The Automatic Stay Imposed by 11 U.S.C §362 filed by Movant Gregory McCloud in the above styled and numbered cause, notice of the filing and hearing of said Motion having been given in accordance with the Rules of this Court, no objection or response to said motion having been filed within the time provided by the Rules of this court, and the Court, being fully advised in the premises, finds and determines as follows to wit:

1. That the benefits recoverable by the Movant under his Mississippi Workers' Compensation claim will be paid by the Debtor's Workers' Compensation Insurance Carrier. No monetary liability is attached directly to the Debtor related to Movants' claim.
2. Accordingly, the Movant is entitled to the entry of an Order For Relief From The Automatic Stay imposed by 11 U.S.C §362, specifically granting him the right to proceed in the pursuance of his worker's compensation claim under the Mississippi Workers' Compensation Commission, or by any other means.
3. It is, therefore ordered and adjudged that the automatic stay imposed by 11

U.S.C §362 is hereby lifted as to Movant Gregory McCloud, and said Movant Gregory McCloud is hereby granted the authority to pursue his Mississippi Workers' Compensation claim against the Debtor and (more specifically) the Debtor's Workers' Compensation Insurance company (New Hampshire Insurance Company, and its' Service Company Chartis Claims, Inc.).
