25 Q And did you call for that?

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2 A Yes.

3 Q Do you have a proposed agenda for
4 that?

5 A Working on it.

6 Q Do you have any idea what's going to
7 be on that agenda, as we sit here?

8 A Yes.

9 Q What's going to be on the agenda as
10 far as you know today?

11 A The status of the case as it relates
12 to Quigley.

13 Q But you don't know whether that's
14 going to be your first meeting as chairman of
15 board or not?

16 A No.

17 Q Where are meetings held generally?

18 A Telephonically.

19 Q Do you get paid extra for a board
20 meeting?

21 A No.

22 Q Since you became president in April
23 of 2008, have any of your day-to-day -- has
24 any of your day-to-day work changed at all?

25 A Yes.

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2 that you became president?

3 A Correct.

4 Q Do you know, was Mr. Street still
5 president on March 28, 2008?

6 A Yes.

7 Q Do you know why Mr. Street didn't
8 sign this and you did?

9 A I don't recall.

10 Q Nobody explained that to you?

11 A No.

12 Q How did it come about that you
13 signed it? Somebody just gave it to you to
14 sign?

15 A Paul had tendered his resignation
16 effective March 31st.

17 Q And did you read this before you
18 signed it?

19 A Yes.

20 Q I want to take a look at Page 111
21 first.

22 Specifically on Page 111, the
23 Subheading B, Business of Reorganized
24 Quigley.

25 Do you see that?

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2 Q So as you sit here today, you
3 can't -- Quigley can't tell me the
4 relationship between the amount of the Pfizer
5 contribution and the amount that Pfizer is
6 getting?

7 MR. COOK: Objection.

8 A I wouldn't know about it.

9 Q Do you think it would be appropriate
10 for Pfizer to make a contribution in the
11 range of \$400 million get benefits of more
12 than \$4 billion?

13 MR. COOK: Objection.

14 MS. FROST: Objection to the form.

15 A It's not my call.

16 Q Whose call is it?

17 A Pfizer.

18 Q It's Pfizer's call; is that right?
19 Is that what you are saying?

20 A Why don't you repeat the question?

12 does to Quigley.

13 Q Do you know if anybody at Pfizer has
14 analyzed the value of the benefits it's
15 receiving under the plan?

16 A I wouldn't know that information.

17 Q Have you had discussions with
18 anybody about the value of the benefits which
19 Pfizer is receiving under the plan?

20 A No.

21 Q Do you intend to have those
22 discussions?

23 A No.

24 Q If I look at Page 13 -- you look at
