**ORDER AUTHORIZING THE RETENTION
AND EMPLOYMENT OF SAK MANAGEMENT SERVICES, LLC, AS
MEDICAL OPERATIONS ADVISOR, NUNC PRO TUNC AS OF SEPTEMBER 18, 2018**

Upon the application (the “**Application**”)² of Suzanne Koenig, the patient care ombudsman (the “**Ombudsman**”) appointed in the above-captioned chapter 11 case (the “**Case**”), for entry of an Order, pursuant to sections 105, 330 and 333 of title 11 of the United States Code, 11 U.S.C. §§ 101 *et seq.* (the “**Bankruptcy Code**”) and Rules 2014 and 2016 of the

Federal Rules of Bankruptcy Procedure (the “**Bankruptcy Rules**”), authorizing the retention and employment of SAK Management Services, LLC (“**SAK**”), as medical operations advisor for the Ombudsman, *nunc pro tunc* as of September 18, 2018; and upon reviewing and considering the Koenig Declaration and the Application; and it appearing that the Court has jurisdiction over the Application pursuant to 28 U.S.C. §157(b)(2)(A); and due and adequate notice of the Application having been given; and it appearing that no other or further notice need be given; and this Court having determined that based upon the representations in the Application and the Koenig Declaration, SAK represents no interest adverse to the Debtor’s estate or its creditors with respect to the matters upon which it is to be engaged, SAK is a disinterested person as that term is defined under section 101(14) of the Bankruptcy Code, and SAK’s employment is in the best interests of the Debtor’s estate and its creditors; and after due deliberation and sufficient cause appearing therefor;

IT IS HEREBY ORDERED THAT:

1. The Application is granted to the extent provided herein.
2. The Ombudsman is authorized to retain SAK, as medical operations advisor, pursuant to sections 105 and 333 of the Bankruptcy Code, *nunc pro tunc* as of September 18, 2018, to perform the services set forth in the Application.
3. SAK shall be compensated in accordance with procedures set forth in the Application, sections 330 and 331 of the Bankruptcy Code, the Bankruptcy Rules, the Local Rules, the United States Trustee Guidelines and the Orders of this Court.
4. The Court shall retain jurisdiction to hear and determine all matters arising from the implementation of this Order.
