NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN that if no written objection thereto is filed with the Clerk of the U.S. Bankruptcy Court, U.S. Courthouse, 500 State Avenue, Room 161, Kansas City, Kansas, 66101, and received by counsel for Debtor (undersigned) within twenty-one (21) days from the date of this Notice (**on or before October 15, 2012**), the below listed Motions and Applications (the "Twenty One Day Motions and Applications") of the Debtor will be granted by entry of an order to be prepared and submitted by counsel for the Debtor. **If an objection is timely filed, a nonevidentiary hearing will be held** before the U.S. Bankruptcy Court, 500 State Avenue, Room 144, Kansas City, Kansas, 66101, on **October 25, 2012, at 1:30 p.m. Central Standard Time**, or as soon thereafter as the same may be heard.
