**MONTHLY STATEMENT OF SERVICES RENDERED AND
EXPENSES INCURRED BY STINSON MORRISON HECKER LLP FOR
PERIOD NOVEMBER 1, 2012 THROUGH NOVEMBER 30, 2012**

In accordance with 11 U.S.C. §§ 105(a), 328, 330 and 331, and this Court's Order Granting the Debtor's Motion to Establish Procedures for Interim Compensation and Reimbursement of Expenses of Professionals entered October 27, 2012 (Docket No. 164), establishing procedures for interim compensation and reimbursement of expenses of professionals ("Interim Compensation Order"), Stinson Morrison Hecker LLP ("Stinson"), counsel to the above-captioned debtor and debtor-in-possession, hereby submits its Monthly Statement of Services Rendered and Fees Incurred for the Period November 1, 2012 Through November 30, 2012 (the "Statement").

FEES AND EXPENSES FOR MONTHLY STATEMENT

1. A summary of the services rendered by Stinson for which compensation is sought by project category is as follows:

2. All professional services were performed by Stinson for and on behalf of the Debtor and no other individual creditor, or any other persons.

3. During the Statement period, Stinson has performed necessary, reasonable and valuable legal services for Debtor with a total of approximately 386.60 hours expended therefore. The specific number of hours, timekeeper's name, hourly rate and total fee amounts are listed and broken down below:

4. A complete and accurate accounting of the time identified above is itemized on each statement attached hereto collectively as **Exhibit A**. Generally, Stinson's activity generating the fees and expenses set out herein can be summarized as follows:

- a. Business Operations -- meetings, calls and memos regarding landlord issues and possible transactions
- b. Case Administration -- extensive work on various case administration matters, including critical vendor issues, hearings on 11/5 and 11/28, monthly reports and reports for unsecured creditors committee

- c. Claims – work on various creditor claims, amendments to schedules and notices of same to affected creditors, and analysis of claims filed by 11/16 bar date
- d. Fees/Employment – review and discuss Applications for Unsecured Creditors Committee professionals, work on Monthly Statements for Stinson and Robert Rayburn
- e. Financing – work on the extension of DIP financing order
- f. Litigation – work on the Spirit issues for the 11/28 confirmation hearing and appeal to the Bankruptcy Appellate Panel
- g. Plan and Disclosure Statement – extensive work with various creditors and client regarding the pending Disclosure Statement and Plan for 11/5 and 11/28 disclosure statement and confirmation hearings

5. The hourly rates charged by Stinson are the standard rates charged on routine, non-complicated matters, without considering the size of the case and degree of responsibility, difficulty, complexity, and results achieved. Based on such rates, the value of the professional services rendered during the Statement period totals \$130,558.00 with the average hourly rate for the attorneys during this period being approximately \$360.60. To minimize the expense of the services provided, Stinson has, wherever possible, avoided duplication of effort and delegated appropriate tasks to associates and paralegals with a lesser billing rate.

6. Stinson has incurred expenses during the Statement period in the amount of \$4,749.91 which are also itemized on the statements summarized above. The reimbursement of expenses requested by Stinson are expenses normally billed to the firm's clients in other matters, including both bankruptcy and non-bankruptcy matters and are the standard practice for law firms in the Kansas City metropolitan area. A summary of the expenses incurred by Stinson during the Statement period is as follows:

7. No agreement or understanding prohibited by Section 504 of the Bankruptcy Code exists between Stinson and any other person or entity for the sharing of compensation or reimbursement received or to be received for services rendered in connection with this case.

8. In accordance with the Interim Compensation Order, the Statement has been served upon the following parties: (i) counsel to Dickinson Theatres, Inc., Stinson Morrison Hecker LLP, Attn: Sharon L. Stolte, Esq., 1201 Walnut Street, Suite 2900, Kansas City, Missouri 64106; (ii) Benjamin Blaustein, Kelley Drye & Warren LLP, 101 Park Avenue, New York, New York, 10178, counsel for the Official Committee of Unsecured Creditors, and; (iii) the Office of the United States Trustee, United States Trustee, Attn: Joyce G. Owen, 301 North Main Street, Suite 1150, Wichita, Kansas 67202 (collectively, the "Notice Parties").

9. Pursuant to the Interim Compensation Order, objections to this Statement, if any, must be served upon the Notice Parties, including Stinson, no later than **December 24, 2012** (the "Objection Deadline"), setting forth the nature of the objection and the specific amount of fees or expenses at issue.

10. If no objections to the Statement are received on or before the Objection Deadline, the Debtor will pay to Stinson 100% of the fees and 100% of the expenses identified in the Statement.

11. Stinson respectfully requests and reserves the right to supplement this application with additional time descriptions or other material, as appropriate, after determining all questions, comments or objections from all parties.
