## PSZYJW ATTENDANCE AT HEARINGS

### APRIL 3, 2003

- Attended by Laura Davis Jones, Ira Kharasch, and Chris Lhulier.
- Chris Lhulier prepared orders and pleadings for presentation to the court, revising them as necessary (while orders and pleadings were generally prepared before hearings, revisions to the documents, while court was in session, occurred frequently, and additional documents were often required), took notes regarding the scheduling and disposition of matters; conferred with opposing counsel to resolve outstanding issues; and communicated with the Debtors, K&E and PSZYJW regarding additional information and materials required throughout the course of hearing.<sup>1</sup> In addition, while Mr. Lhulier did not himself address the Court, because he worked on a large number of motions before they were presented at the hearings, he was available to consult with Laura Davis Jones when specific issues arose at the hearings with respect to those motions.
- Laura Davis Jones coordinated the hearing from the debtors' perspective according to the agenda (as she did for all the hearings), and handled many substantive matters, including:
  - cash collateral (jointly with Richard Wynne of Kirkland & Ellis);
  - employee wage and health/welfare benefits issues;
  - customer programs, shipping and warehousing;
  - customer programs; and
  - scheduling and case management matters, including the scheduling of pending motions and objection deadlines.
- Ira Kharasch attended the hearing and negotiated (as did Steve Kotarba of K&E) with groups of PACA and reclamation claimants both during the hearing, and immediately afterwards, working to resolve these claimants objections to the extent possible. Significantly, Mr. Kharasch and Mr. Kotarba were able to negotiate a successful resolution of the PACA claimants' objection to debtor financing.

### APRIL 10, 2003

- Attended by Laura Davis Jones and Chris Lhulier.
- Laura Davis Jones coordinated the hearing from the debtors' perspective according to the agenda (as she did for all the hearings), and addressed the court with respect to the Sentry stipulation and cash collateral.
- Chris Lhulier performed case coordination tasks.

- Laura Davis Jones coordinated the hearing from the debtors' perspective according to the agenda (as she did for all the hearings), and addressed the court with respect to
  - lease rejection issues;
  - applications to employ professionals;
  - EFS National Bank's motion for relief from stay/setoff;
  - ordinary course professionals;
  - the interim order limiting the trading of equity securities of the Debtor; and
  - the scheduling and continuance of matters to be heard at future hearings.
- Ira Kharasch addressed the court with respect to bidding procedures for the sale of 31 Rainbow retail grocery stores.
- Chris Lhulier performed case coordination tasks.

**MAY 27, 2003**

- Attended by Laura Davis Jones and Chris Lhulier.
- Laura Davis Jones coordinated the hearing from the debtors' perspective according to the agenda (as she did for all the hearings), and addressed the court with respect to:
  - relief from the cash management order;
  - constructive trust issues; and
  - the scheduling and continuance of matters to be heard at future hearings.

- Laura Davis Jones coordinated the hearing from the debtors' perspective according to the agenda (as she did for all the hearings), and addressed the court with respect to:
  - retention of professionals;
  - stipulations with respect to certain utilities;
  - lease rejection issues; and
  - various matters covered by certificates of no objection.
