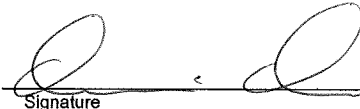

Dear Sirs:

I am submitting a revised Form 410 Proof of Claim in the case of Fox Ortega Enterprises ( 16-40050 WJL 7) . The original claim regarding wines sold to me by this merchant but never delivered provided details on all the unfulfilled transactions with a total claim of \$ 39, 555.47. Since that time I have recovered \$ 2283.95 through the chargeback process of Chase/Visa card services. Therefore, the current claim has been revised accordingly to a total of \$ 37,271.52.

I am working with the charge dispute process at two other credit card companies involved in my transactions with Fox Ortega/Premier Cru. Is it possible that I may recover additional funds but this is still being investigated by the card issuers. Should further funds be recovered through processes other than Bankruptcy proceedings , I will submit details as the processes are finalized.
