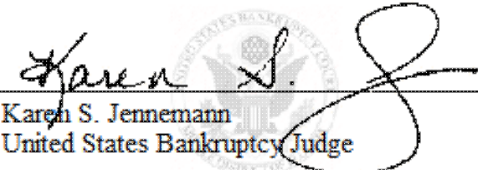

***ORDER GRANTING MOTION TO APPEAR PRO HAC VICE
AND DIRECTING PAYMENT TO THE UNITED STATES DISTRICT COURT***

THIS CASE came on for consideration, without hearing, of the Motion to Appear Pro Hac Vice (Document # 31) ("Motion") of attorney *Jennifer E. Niemann* for representation of *RS Lending, Inc.* . Accordingly, it is **ORDERED**:

1. The Motion is Granted.
2. Attorney *Jennifer E. Niemann* is admitted to appear before this Court in this case and any related adversary proceeding as counsel for *RS Lending, Inc.* subject to Local Rule 2090-1.
3. Within fourteen days from the date of this order, attorney *Jennifer E. Niemann* shall pay to the Clerk, of the United States District Court for the Middle District of Florida, an Attorney Special Admission Fee in the amount of \$150.00 and upon payment of the fee, file a Notice of Compliance with the Clerk of the U.S. Bankruptcy Court. 4. Upon completion of the Court's electronic filing registration forms and requirements, the Clerk is directed to issue attorney *Jennifer E. Niemann* , a temporary login and password to the Court's electronic filing system (CM/ECF) with filing privileges limited to this case and any related adversary proceedings. CM/ECF access request should be directed to the ECF Helpdesk at ecfhelp@flmb.uscourts.gov. PACER accounts required for viewing, must be set up by the attorney through PACER at <http://www.pacer.gov>.

The Clerk's office is directed to serve a copy of this order on interested parties.

*All references to "Debtor" shall include and refer to both of the debtors in a case filed jointly by two individuals.
