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collectively the "Laing Creditors") hereby enter into this stipulation, based on the following:

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RECITALS

- 1. On September 22, 2008, the Laing Creditors filed a proof of claim in the amount of \$1,309,326.68 against Cameo ("Claim 4-1"). On October 21, 2009, the Laing Creditors filed an amended proof of claim in the amount of \$14,411,171.19 against Cameo ("Claim 4-2").
- 2. On March 26, 2010, the Debtors filed their First Omnibus Objection to Duplicate and/or Superseded Claims (the "Objection") [Docket No. 636]. By the Objection, the Debtors objected to Claim No. 4-1 on the grounds that that same had been superseded and amended by Claim No. 4-2. By the Objection, the Debtors further reserved their rights to object to Claim No. 4-2 on any other grounds whatsoever.
- 3. On April 12, 2010, the Laing Creditors filed a Limited Objection of Laing/Sequoia Partners LLC and South Banning Properties LLC to Debtors First Omnibus Objection to Duplicate and/or Superseded Claims (the "Limited Objection") [Docket No. 654]. In the Limited Objection, the Laing Creditors do not dispute that Claim No. 4-2 superseded Claim No. 4-1, but requested that the Debtors specifically waive any timeliness objection to Claim No. 4-2 since the Laing Creditors original proof of claim, Claim No. 4-1, was filed before the claims bar date.
- 4. The Debtors have agreed that they will not object to Claim No. 4-2 on the grounds that the same was filed after the claims bar date inasmuch as the original proof of claim was timely filed.

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STIPULATION

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NOW THEREFORE, it is hereby stipulated and agreed that:

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- 1. Claim 4-1, which has been superseded by Claim 4-2, will be expunged and disallowed in full.
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2. The Debtors (or any other successor-in-interest) shall have the right to object to Claim 4-2 on any grounds whatsoever except that the Debtors (or their successors-in-interest) will

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1	not object to Claim No. 4-2 on the grounds that the same was filed after the claims bar date as
2	Claim 4-1 was timely filed.
3	3. This Stipulation resolves the issues raised in the Limited Objection filed by the
4	Laing Creditors.
