

Disguised names kept divorce quiet

Adoptions aren't the only thing that **Sandra Bullock** is great at keeping secret. The Oscar-winning star filed for divorce in code five days before word got out.

TMZ.com reports that Bullock's April 23 petition in Travis County Court, in Austin, Texas, was filed under her initials, backward: B.A.S.

Her soon-to-be-ex-husband, **Jesse James**, was identified by his initials scrambled: J.J.G. His middle name is Gregory.

A court clerk confirmed the information to E! News.

According to the petition, Bullock is a resident of Texas — she owns two Austin restaurants and is believed to have a home there — and James "agrees to proceed" in court there.

The three-page filing reads: "The marriage between Petitioner and Respondent has be-

come insupportable because of discord or conflict of personalities that destroys the legitimate ends of the marriage relationship and prevents any reasonable expectations of reconciliation," according to TMZ.

James told People magazine, "The decision to let my wife end our marriage, and continue the adoption of [baby] Louis on her own, has been the hardest decision of his life. "[P]lease do not judge Sandy for the things I have done," he said. "She has done no wrong."



The procedure would have





She could be courting jail

Lindsay Lohan remained in Cannes yesterday as her mother, Dina Lohan, at home in Merrick, worked to replace the passport Lindsay's attorney said was stolen while the actress attended the city's film festival. The issue took on urgency since Lindsay, 23, was due to appear in Los Angeles County Superior Court this morning for a DUI probation hearing — from which her absence could lead to a warrant for her arrest.

"With the time difference, it's been very difficult trying to get everyone on the phone," Dina Lohan, 47, told Newsday. "It's been horrible. I haven't slept in 24 hours. My daughter was crying to me over the

phone. This was traumatic for her."

Maryse Nebatti, the duty officer in Marseilles for the U.S. Embassy in France, said the passport was reported stolen but no formal replacement request was filed as of yesterday afternoon New York time, according to RadarOnline.com. Nebatti said Lohan had faxed a copy of her passport to the embassy's Paris office, where a Lohan representative from the United States phoned at 6:25 p.m. local time, and spoke with an after-hours staffer.

"We filled out the application," Dina Lohan said, adding that they're receiving help in France from the producer of Lindsay's recent British documentary "Lindsay Lohan's Indian Journey." She expects a temporary passport will be issued today.

"We're taking it a hundred percent seriously," Dina said of the probation hearing, for which she was planning to

fly to Los Angeles yesterday evening. "Lindsay always has taken it seriously. God willing the judge will listen to the place Lindsay goes," she said, referring to the report filed by the alcohol-education center, Right On Programs of Glendale, Calif., which said that while Lindsay has not completed the required number of classes so far, she is in compliance by the center's definition, "attends regularly" and "[H]er attitude is positive and receptive to ideas regarding lifestyle changes."

That may not be enough for the L.A. County District Attorney's office, which according to TMZ.com, citing "well-placed sources" there, wants Judge Marsha Revel to issue a bench warrant for Lindsay's arrest.

Lindsay's father, Michael Lohan, 50, told Newsday he hopes the judge will mandate inpatient rehab in lieu of jail. "It's obvious that Lindsay needs help, not incarceration."

Lindsay Lohan's passport was reportedly stolen while she was at Cannes.

Near drownings, maiming in Suffolk

The Independence Day weekend got off to a dangerous start yesterday in Suffolk County, where a toddler and a man nearly drowned in Seiden and Ronkonoma and a man had his arm blown off by illegal fireworks in Islip Terrace.

Doctors last night were working toreatach Eric Smith's left arm after the accident, Suffolk County police said.

Smith, 36, was using a 3-foot metal tube to shoot mortars from the street in front of his Fairview Avenue home. "As the explosive shot out of the launcher, it struck Mr. Smith in his left arm, completely severing it from his shoulder," a police spokesman said.

The blast happened at about 5:45 p.m. We believe he leaped over to ignite it, and didn't get out of the way in time and it blew off his left arm," the spokesman said.

Smith's family and friends packed the severed arm in a cooler and sent it with Smith to Southside Hospital in Bay Shore, where Smith is in serious condition, the

spokesman said. Suffolk's Third Squad detectives are investigating.

In Seiden, the toddler, 2, was pulled out of a pool on Salem Lane by her grandfather and is expected to live, Suffolk police said.


The grandfather administered rescue breathing to the girl, who had been in the pool for several minutes when she was found at about 3:36 p.m., a police department spokesman said.

After her grandfather administered the rescue breathing, the girl coughed up water and started breathing again. She was brought to Stony Brook University Medical Center. Her condition was not known last night.

In Ronkonoma, an 83-year-old man from Brooklyn was found unconscious in the shallow part of an in-ground pool.

The man, Rolando Villalba, had been in the pool on Express Drive South for just a few minutes when he was found, his friends told police.

Villalba, of Goodwin Place, was brought to Smithtown's St. Catherine of Siena Medical Center in critical condition.



Kate sorry for 'sharp tongue'



Kate Gosselin conceded on "Today" yesterday morning that she was too hard on her ex-husband Jon during their marriage, while Jon himself took to Twitter in the early afternoon to defend Kate and himself against charges by her brother.

In part two of the two-day interview, Kate Gosselin expanded on a quote Meredith Vieira read from Gosselin's new book, "I Just Want You to Know," in which she wrote, "Much of what I said to Jon [during the marriage] was unwarranted. I could have guarded my tongue better."

She told Vieira, "I learned that in the heat of the moment, I have a sharp tongue. And looking back, there are probably a lot of people that I love that I probably spoke to inappropriately. Those are the people that are beside you to support you and love you. I've really learned to watch what I say."

One of those people, presumably, would be her brother,

Kevin Kreider, who testified before state lawmakers yesterday about Pennsylvania child labor laws as they relate to TV and film production. According to TMZ.com, Kreider and his wife, Jodi, testified the Gosselin children had no privacy during tapings of "Jon & Kate Plus 8," were manipulated by TLC producers for drama and suffered psychological damage because of the show.

Shortly afterward, Jon Gosselin tweeted, "Kate and I were doing what was best for our

family. And it gave us an opportunity to spend quality family time together," adding, "The allegations made today by Kevin and Jodi Kreider have not been my experience at all during the production of 'Jon & Kate Plus 8.'"

Kate Gosselin in the "Today" interview also defended her appearance on "Dancing With the Stars" and to launch a new reality show this summer.

"I don't see another option — I have eight children to provide for."

No permits for the kids

Child-labor permits should have been obtained for the children appearing on "Jon & Kate Plus 8," but the state will not take legal action against the producers, Pennsylvania regulators have concluded.

No action will be taken provided a portion of the proceeds from the now-canceled reality show are put into a trust fund for Jon and Kate Gosselin's children and child-labor permits are obtained for future filming, the state Department of Labor & Industry said in a five-page letter obtained yesterday by The Associated Press. "It's important to note that we did an investigation and we made sure the children were not in any danger or endangered as a result of the work they were doing," said Labor & Industry press secretary Troy Thompson.

Troupe tunes into King of Pop

First the Beatles and Elvis Presley, now Michael Jackson.

The acrobatic troupe Cirque du Soleil announced that it will put on a live touring show featuring the songs of the King of Pop starting late next year. The Associated Press reports.

That will be followed by a permanent production in Las Vegas in 2012 at a property owned by MGM Mirage Inc. The casino company did not say which venue will host the show. A nightclub in Las Vegas will also open with the show.

Cirque and Jackson's estate will each own 50 percent of the projects and share equally in the cost of putting them on. The estate will also receive royalties from the use of Jackson's music and other assets.

Jackson, who died at age 50 last June after a drug overdose, was described as a

"huge fan" of the French Canadian performance group.

He saw their first tent show in Santa Monica, Calif., many years ago with longtime lawyer and now estate co-executor, John Branca.

And he visited their Montreal headquarters in 2004, Cirque chief executive Daniel Lamarre said.

The touring show will be a simulation of a Jackson concert, while the Las Vegas show will be more theatrical and more technologically advanced, Lamarre said.

Boldly going to retire



"Also, I don't think it would be fair to Zachary Quinto," of NBC's sci-fi series "Heroes," who played the young Spock in last summer's "Star Trek" movie relaunch. Penn pleads no contest in dust-up

Matellan says those hours can be completed through Penn's earthquake-relief efforts in Haiti.

He was also ordered to undergo 36 hours of anger management counseling and stay 100 yards away from the photographer.

Lindsay Lohan remained in Cannes yesterday as her mother, Dina Lohan, at home in Merrick, worked to replace the passport Lindsay's attorney said was stolen while the actress attended the city's film festival. The issue took on urgency since Lindsay, 23, was due to appear in Los Angeles County Superior Court this morning for a DUI probation progress hearing — from which her absence could lead to a warrant for her arrest.

"With the time difference, it's been very difficult trying to get everyone on the phone," Dina Lohan, 47, told Newsday. "It's been horrible. I haven't slept in 24 hours. My daughter was crying to me over the

phone. This was traumatic for her."

Maryse Nebatti, the duty officer in Marseilles for the U.S. Embassy in France, said the passport was reported stolen but no formal replacement request was filed as of yesterday afternoon. New York Times, according to RadarOnline.com, Nebatti said Lohan had faxed a copy of her passport to the embassy's Paris office, where a Lohan representative from the United States phoned at 6:25 p.m. local time, and spoke with an after-hours staffer.

"We filled out the application," Dina Lohan said, adding that they're receiving help in France from the producer of Lindsay's recent British documentary "Lindsay Lohan's Indian Journey." She expects a temporary passport will be issued today.

"We're taking it a hundred percent seriously," Dina said of the probation hearing, for which she was planning to



FBI sting targeted Holloway suspect

WASHINGTON — The FBI thought it was closing in on Joran van der Sloot in the Natalie Holloway missing-teenager case, paying him at least \$15,000 in a sting operation, federal officials said yesterday. But when the agency delayed his arrest to build a murder case, he took the money and headed for Peru, where authorities say he now has confessed to killing a different young woman.

location of the young woman's body on the island of Aruba. Aruba authorities have been frustrated in their efforts to prosecute van der Sloot because they have been unable to find Holloway's remains.

The federal officials said yesterday that Holloway's mother contacted authorities in Aruba, and the FBI set a sting operation in motion targeting van der Sloot. He has since been charged in Alabama with trying to extort money from the family. The \$15,000 was wired to a bank account he controlled, officials added.

Bo Dietl, a private investigator who has been working with an attorney for the Holloways, John Kelly, said van der Sloot received an additional \$10,000 in cash. In April, shortly after his father died, van der Sloot contacted Kelly and offered to explain how Holloway died in exchange for \$250,000. Dietl said.

Dietl said that at a May 10 meeting in Aruba, Kelly offered van der Sloot \$25,000 upfront, with the rest to be delivered once the body was found. He said he pushed Natalie Holloway, her head hit a rock.



Arizona feels far, far away

Ready for another hot-blooded round of immigration debate? Ready or not, here it comes.

Barack Obama's big speech was Thursday. And any moment now, the Justice Department will be filing suit against the state of Arizona, contending that the toughest-in-America immigration law is plainly unconstitutional.

So why does all this seem so far away?

It's not that Long Island doesn't struggle to absorb its fresh immigration, some legal, some not. It's certainly not that our politicians are above pandering on the issue or that the stresses of fresh immigration don't pop up here and there. But compared to the roar of the border states — and compared to the roar of talk radio — life with and for new immigrants has been relatively benign around here.

Not perfect by a long shot, but little of the open hostility of Tucson or Albuquerque or San Diego.

Around New York and Long Island, the economy has done a relatively good job absorbing the newcomers. There are reasons for this good reason. Our immigrants come from more diverse than farm labor and construction.

And we have a tradition — this should not be discounted — of absorbing waves of immigrants from all around the world. We have that lady in New York harbor. She stands for something this Independence Day.


Morgan's got talent? He's likely to replace King

America's Got Talent judge **Piers Morgan** appears to be the front-runner to claim the CNN talk show long hosted by **Larry King**, and he has won permission from NBC, which airs the hit talent contest, to pursue the CNN job.

Appearing yesterday on MSNBC's "Morning Joe," NBC Universal chief executive **Jeff Zucker** noted that Morgan is contractually bound to continue on "America's Got Talent" for three more years, The Associated Press reports.

Having said that, I can also tell you that he has approached us about asking us to do another job as well," said Zucker, without naming CNN or its talk show, soon to be vacated by King.

"I don't think they're mutually exclusive," Zucker said. Along with candidates such as **Katie Couric** and **Ryan Seacrest**, Morgan has been considered a favorite to replace King, who on June 29 announced his departure from the prime-time perch he has oc-

cupied for a quarter-century. King, 76, said he would step down from his weekday show this fall.

Morgan, now King's likely successor, would bring a sharper-edged sensibility to a show entrenched in King's easygoing, regular-Joe style.

Morgan is a 45-year-old former British tabloid editor who turned to television several years ago. In 2008, he won the competition as a contestant on NBC's "Celebrity Apprentice."

For real? 'The Hills' staged?

So was "The Hills" cooked the whole time? Or perhaps partially cooked, like a still-bleeding steak that has to be sent back to the kitchen? What exactly did that ending mean Tuesday night?

In a classic wrap for a classic reality show, Tuesday's finale stripped away the artifice, literally, as stage hands pushed aside a huge Hollywood backdrop revealing nothing more than a drab, industrial movie lot where these glam lives, presumably glittered for six seasons.

But still the question as it's supposed to linger: Were fans suckered over 102 episodes, or suckered for merely portions of them? If so, "The Hills" could go down as one of the greatest tongs in TV history — a master forgery that fooled some of the people sometimes, but (let's be candid) not all of

the people all the time. The dialogue always seemed much too — what's the word? — practiced. The on-again-off-again-on-again romances seemed far too camera-ready, perfect. It often felt contrived.

Yet still MTV insisted: These lives are real, and this show is "reality," which of course meant these lives were authentic enough to be covered by tabloid magazines and shows. And they were, exhaustively.

Final word on the finale goes to **Liz Gateley**, executive producer of "The Hills," who said last night in a phone interview,

"we wanted to go out with a bang, and thought that at the end of the day the one thing that viewers constantly ask is — is it real or fake? [The ending] was a wink and a nod to them and certainly not a statement that everything was fake." She adds, "all the dynamics on the show are really real. Did we produce situations and say 'you broke up with your boyfriend between seasons — could you at least go and drop off his stuff? Sure. We can't. Those were the kinds of things we do, but the underlying dynamics are all real."


