OMNIBUS OBJECTION TO REDUCE OR MODIFY CLAIM NUMBER 207 FILED
AGAINST THE DEBTOR BY CONSOLIDATED EDISON COMPANY OF NEW YORK,
INC.

FOR THE SOUTHERN DISTRICT OF NEW YORK:

The Consolidated Edison Company of New York, Inc. ("Con Edison") by its attorney Richard W. Babinecz, Leon Z. Mener, of Counsel, objects to that portion of Debtor's Trust Administrator's motion that seeks to reduce claim No. 207, the claim filed by Consolidated Edison Company of New York, Inc. ("Con Edison"), against Jennifer Convertibles, Inc., in the amount of \$38,997.39.

The debtor's objection argues that claim number 207, in the amount of \$38,997.39, was an Overstated Claim that was filed in the incorrect amount according to the Debtor's Books and Records and seeks to reduce and modify claim number 207

to \$24,384.48.

Con Edison filed pre-petition claim, claim number 88, on September 16, 2010 for \$38,328.38 for utility services supplied up to the filing date, July 18, 2010, for 27 accounts the debtor had in our service territory. A copy of the claim filed is attached as Exhibit "A". Con Edison filed an amendment to claim number 88 on October 12, 2010, due to the discovery of one other account not filed with the other 27 accounts, which increased the pre-petition claim. The amended claim, claim number 207, was for \$38,997.39. See attached as Exhibit "B".

The amended claim accurately reflects the unpaid balance owed of \$38,997.39 for service supplied to July 18, 2010, for a higher amount. The Debtor's Books and Records may differ from Con Edison's records, because the final bills were not mailed to the Debtor because this could be construed as violating the automatic stay.


Based on Con Edison's books and records the final balance of \$38,997.39 associated with claim no. 207 reflects the unpaid balance owed for pre-petition services as of the bankruptcy petition date. The Debtor claims the unpaid balance is \$24,384.48, but fails to set forth the balance for each account. It is likely that when the debtor examines each account statement attached to Con Edison's claim it will discover that the unpaid balance of \$24,384.48 fails to include the final bills.

THEREFORE, Con Edison respectfully requests that this Court deny the
Trust Administrator's motion as it relates to Con Edison.
