### **AMENDED COMPLAINT**

NOW COMES, the plaintiff, James Johnson ("Johnson"), sues defendant, K Mart Corporation ("K Mart") and alleges:

#### INTRODUCTION \*

- 1. This action involves a disability claim in violation of the Americans with Disabilities Act ("ADA").
- 2. Plaintiff, Johnson, was a former manager of retail stores owned and operated by defendant, K Mart.
- 3. As an employee, Johnson was entitled to the benefits of K Mart's long term disability insurance plan.
- 4. During the course of his employment with K Mart, Johnson was forced to seek medical and psychological attention due to severe depression and emotional distress.
- 5. In or around October of 1997, Johnson was taken out of work by his physician due to his mental health condition.
  - 6. Johnson, thereafter, applied for and received long term disability benefits under K

Mart's long term disability benefits plan.

- 7. Johnson brings this Americans with Disabilities Act ("ADA") lawsuit against K mart because K Mart's long term disability benefits plan provides for a two year limit on the benefits to which Johnson is entitled for his mental health related disability.
  - 8. There is no such two year limit for physical illnesses.
- 9. K Mart's two year limitation for mental health illnesses is not related to any cost analysis or mental health illness related claims and, thus, constitutes discrimination against Johnson on the basis of a disability in violation of the Americans with Disabilities Act.

## JURISDICTION AND VENUE

- 10. The plaintiff brings this action to redress violations of the Americans with Disabilities Act, 42 U.S.C. § 12101, et seq. This court has subject matter jurisdictions over the plaintiff's federal law claims pursuant to 28 U.S.C. § 1331.
- 11. At the time of the discriminatory conduct complained of herein, the plaintiff in this was lawsuit was employed by K Mart in Tampa, Florida. The events which give rise to this lawsuit occurred in Tampa.
- 12. K Mart "resides" in this District of this United States District Court within the meaning of 28 U.S.C. § 1391(c).
- 13. Venue is therefore proper in this District of this United States District Court under 28 U.S.C. § 1391(b).

#### THE PARTIES

14. Defendant, K Mart Corporation, is a Michigan Corporation whose principal place of business is Troy, Michigan.

- 15. K Mart is registered and authorized to conduct business in the State of Florida and maintains its principal office of operations for Florida in Jacksonville, Florida. K Mart may be served in accordance with Rule 4 of the Federal Rules of Civil Procedure.
- 16. Plaintiff, James Johnson, is a citizen of the United States and a resident of Florida. Johnson's date of birth is 01/02/43.
  - 17. Johnson began his employment with K Mart in 09/01/67.
  - 18. Johnson submits himself to the jurisdiction and venue of this court.

# **COMPLIANCE WITH ADMINISTRATIVE PROCEDURES**

- The plaintiff incorporates by reference all the preceding paragraphs of this Complaint.
- 20. Plaintiff, James Johnson, filed a charge of discrimination (Charge No. 151981169) with the Equal Employment Opportunity Commission ("EEOC") within 180 days of the adverse actions of which he complains in this case. By letter dated 08/31/98, Johnson received a Notice of Right to Sue from the EEOC and files this Complaint to assert claims under the Americans with Disabilities Act within ninety (90) days of receipt of the Right to Sue letter from the EEOC.

## **FACTUAL ALLEGATIONS**

- The plaintiff incorporates by reference all the preceding paragraphs of this Complaint.
- Johnson was employed as a Store Manager at K Mart's store 4245 in Tampa, Florida.
  - 23. In or about February of 1997, Johnson was demoted from the Tampa store which

was a high volume (\$13 million store) to Store 7196 in St. Petersburg, Florida which was a lower volume store (\$7 million).

- 24. On October 27, 1997, approximately 10 months after his demotion to the St. Petersburg, Florida store, Johnson's physician took him out of work.
  - 25. Johnson's physician took him out of work due to a mental health condition.
  - 26. Johnson has never been able to return to work.
- 27. Johnson has applied for and received long term disabilities benefits under K Mart's long term disability benefits plan. However, under the terms of that policy, benefits expire after two years.
- 28. Johnson brings this Americans with Disabilities Act lawsuit against K Mart because K Mart's long term disability benefits plan provides for a two year limit on the benefits to which Johnson is entitled for his mental health related disability.
- 29. There is no such two year limit for physical illnesses under K Mart's long term disability benefits plan.
- 30. K Mart's two year limitation for mental health illnesses is not related to any cost analysis of mental health illness related claims, and, thus, constitutes discrimination against Johnson on the basis of a disability in violation of the Americans with Disabilities Act.

## **DISABILITY DISCRIMINATION**

### (COUNT I)

- The plaintiff incorporates by reference all the preceding paragraphs of this Complaint.
  - 32. K Mart has violated the Americans with Disabilities Act by limiting its long term

disability benefits to a period of two years to this beneficiaries who suffer from mental health disabilities. K Mart's two year benefit limitation is not related to, or the product of, any cost analysis for mental health disability claims.

- 33. K Mart does not impose any such time limitation with respect to long term disability benefit claims which are based upon physical illnesses.
- 34. K Mart's above described actions constitute discrimination against plaintiff

  Johnson on the basis of disability and constitute violations of the Americans with Disabilities Act

  of 1990.

## **DEMAND FOR RELIEF**

WHEREFORE, plaintiff, Johnson demands relief from the court as follows:

- 35. The court declare that the defendant's above-described actions violated the plaintiff's rights secured under the Americans with Disabilities Act.
- 36. The court permanently enjoin the defendant from engaging in any employment policy or practice that discriminates against individuals on the basis of disability; that the court order the defendant to continue the long term disability and until such time as he is able to return to work or until the age of 65.
- 37. The court award compensatory and punitive damages be awarded to the plaintiff against the defendant, including damages for lost long term disability benefits, pain and suffering, and emotional distress.
- 38. The plaintiff recover prejudgment interest on any award of back disability benefits.
  - 39. The court award the plaintiff his attorneys' fees and costs; and the plaintiff be

awarded sch other relief that the court deems just and proper.

## **DEMAND FOR JURY TRIAL**

Plaintiff, Johnson, demands a trial by jury on all issues so triable.
