**SUPPLEMENT TO APPLICATION TO EMPLOY TAFT STETTINIUS &
HOLLISTER LLP AS DEBTOR’S COUNSEL AND ESTABLISH INTERIM
COMPENSATION PROCEDURES**

Madison Park Church of God, Inc., d/b/a Madison Park Church of God, as debtor and debtor-in-possession (the “Debtor”), by counsel, hereby supplements the *Application to Employ Taft Stettinius & Hollister LLP as Debtor’s Counsel and Establish Interim Compensation Procedures* (Docket No. 41) (the “Application”) filed on July 25, 2013. In support of this supplement, the Debtor and Taft Stettinius & Hollister LLP (“Taft”) state as follows:

1. The Declaration of Disinterestedness of Jerald I. Ancel filed on behalf of Taft with the Application disclosed that Taft currently represents Vectren Corporation in matters unrelated to this chapter 11 case.

2. Vectren Corporation (“Vectren”) is a public utility which provides natural gas to the Debtor. On the date this proceeding was commenced Vectren was owed no money by the Debtor and held a \$6,170 deposit.

3. While Taft does not believe that its representation of Vectren constitutes a direct conflict, out of an abundance of caution Taft is submitting a waiver to its

representation of the Debtor and Vectren in matters unrelated to the chapter 11 case pursuant to S.D. Ind. L.R. B-2014(b)(2). A copy of the waiver is attached hereto as **Exhibit A.**

WHEREFORE, the Debtor respectfully request that the Court enter an Order: (1) authorizing and allowing them to employ Taft as its counsel in this chapter 11 case, *nunc pro tunc* to July 12, 2013; (2) finding that Taft is disinterested and has no interest adverse to the Debtor and its estate; and (3) granting the Debtor such other and further relief as the Court deems proper.
