COMPLAINT FOR NEGLIGENCE
AND WILFUL AND WANTON MISCONDUCT

Plaintiff, ANNE SCHREIBER, by and through her attorneys, SHAWN M. COLLINS, CHARLES J. CORRIGAN, EDWARD J. MANZKE, and THE COLLINS LAW FIRM, P.C., of counsel, and NORMAN B. BERGER, MICHAEL D. HAYES, ANNE E. VINER, and VARGA BERGER LEDSKY HAYES & CASEY, a Professional Corporation, of counsel, for her complaint against Defendants, The Lockformer Company, a division of Met-Coil Systems Corporation, a Delaware corporation; Met-Coil Systems Corporation, a Delaware corporation; Mestek, Inc., a Pennsylvania corporation; and Honeywell International, Inc., a Delaware corporation; states and alleges as follows:

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INTRODUCTION

1. This is a case about the devastation by cancer of the life of a promising young woman and physician, Dr. Anne Schreiber, and the reckless conduct that caused it.

In May of 2002, Anne was diagnosed with Non-Hodgkin's Lymphoma, a cancer which attacks the body's immune system, and for which there is no known cure. Anne contracted the cancer because, for more than two decades, these Defendants spilled, poured and dumped into the soil at the Lockformer Property in suburban Lisle thousands of gallons of a highly toxic chemical known as TCE. That TCE invaded the water supply serving Anne's home, unbeknownst to Anne and her family, as she used the TCE-contaminated water for bathing, drinking and cooking for more than eleven years.

TCE exposure can cause Non-Hodgkin's Lymphoma in human beings, and it did so in Anne. As a result, she has been forced to put her medical practice – and the rest of her life -- on hold as she fights to try to restore her health, and confront the reality of living with a deadly cancer.

PARTIES

2. Plaintiff, Anne Schreiber ("Anne"), is a citizen of the State of Illinois who currently resides in Chicago, Illinois. Anne turned 33 years old in July of 2002. She is a medical doctor, practicing in the field of Obstetrics and Gynecology. From January, 1981 through July, 1992, Anne lived with her family at 733 Hitchcock Avenue in Lisle, Illinois (the "Schreiber Home"). The Schreiber Home is one of 186 properties whose then-current owners and residents were class members in the case of LeClercq, et al. v. The Lockformer Company, et al., Case No. 00 C 7164 (Judge Harry D. Leinenweber). The *LeClercq* case concerned damages to the 186 properties (there were no personal injuries alleged therein), caused by TCE contamination

resulting from the very same Defendants' misconduct at issue in this case. *LeClercq* was tried before a jury for two weeks, and then settled when certain Defendants agreed to pay \$10 million to the class.

3. Defendant, Met-Coil Systems Corporation ("Met-Coil"), of which the Lockformer Company is an operating division, is a Delaware Corporation, with its principal place of business in Cedar Rapids, Iowa. Therefore, Met-Coil is a citizen of the State of Delaware and/or Iowa. At all relevant times, Met-Coil has owned the Lockformer Company.

4. Defendant, The Lockformer Company, an unincorporated division of Met-Coil Systems Corporation ("Lockformer"), operates a metal fabrication and manufacturing business at a facility located at 711 Ogden Avenue, Lisle, Illinois, including an approximately 12-acre parcel immediately West of the manufacturing facility. Collectively, the property including Lockformer's facility and the adjacent parcel immediately West of it will be referred to herein as the "Lockformer Property". The Lockformer Property is located directly north and hydrologically upgradient of the Schreiber Home. The Lockformer Property was determined by Judge Leinenweber in *LeClercq* to be a source of the TCE contamination affecting the 186 properties in that case. Indeed, during the *LeClercq* trial, even Lockformer admitted that the Lockformer Property was a source of this TCE contamination.

5. Defendant, Mestek, Inc. ("Mestek") is a Pennsylvania corporation, with its principal place of business in Westfield, Massachusetts. Therefore, Mestek is a citizen of the State of Pennsylvania and/or Massachusetts. Since approximately June of 2000, Mestek has owned and/or operated Lockformer and Met-Coil, and directs and controls environmental issues at the Lockformer Property. Accordingly, any corporate formalities existing between Mestek and Lockformer/Met-Coil should not be observed, or otherwise operate to insulate Mestek from

liability for the conduct of Lockformer / Met-Coil, and Mestek should be regarded as the alter ego of Lockformer/Met-Coil. Facts in support of this conclusion include, but are not limited to:

- (a) Since Mestek's acquisition, there have been no Lockformer/Met-Coil board meetings, and no board action of any kind on any substantive matter, despite there having been quarterly, or more frequent, Lockformer/Met-Coil board meetings prior to Mestek's acquisition;
- (b) Since Mestek's acquisition, Lockformer/Met-Coil's "officers" make no meaningful corporate decisions;
- (c) Since Mestek's acquisition, Mestek has stripped all cash from Lockformer/Met-Coil. Lockformer/Met-Coil has no checking account of its own, and even must obtain prior approval from Mestek's chairman for the purchase of any non-inventory items greater than \$1,000;
- (d) Since Mestek's acquisition, Lockformer/Met-Coil does not even prepare its own financial statements (Mestek does), and Lockformer/Met-Coil's own CFO has no direct participation in the preparation of these financial statements;
- (e) Since Mestek's acquisition, Lockformer/Met-Coil has paid no dividends;
- (f) Even though TCE-related lawsuits and other legal matters now dominate, and threaten, Lockformer/Met-Coil's existence, Mestek makes all decisions regarding environmental issues, including the hiring/firing of environmental consultants for investigation and clean-up of the highly contaminated Lockformer Property, and making all significant decisions in TCE-related litigation and insurance matters - - even where Mestek is not a named party; and
- (g) The fact that TCE-related legal matters threaten Lockformer/Met-Coil's existence, coupled with Mestek's complete control of Lockformer/Met-Coil cash, present the real possibility, indeed the likelihood, that any judgment against Lockformer/Met-Coil greater than Mestek is willing to pay would leave Lockformer/Met-Coil's victim with no meaningful relief.

6. Defendant, Honeywell International, Inc. ("Honeywell") is a Delaware corporation with its principal place of business in Morristown, New Jersey. Therefore, Honeywell is a citizen of the State of Delaware and/or New Jersey. Honeywell has succeeded to the liabilities of the company/companies responsible (as described more fully below) for the spilling and dumping of thousands of gallons of toxic chemicals onto the Lockformer Property, and, at least for purposes of this litigation, should be treated as the same legal entity.

JURISDICTION AND VENUE

7. This Court has original jurisdiction over this matter pursuant to 28 U.S.C. § 1332. Anne is a citizen of the State of Illinois, and no Defendant is a citizen of the State of Illinois. Furthermore, the matter in controversy exceeds, exclusive of interest and costs, the sum of \$75,000.

8. Venue is proper in the Northern District of Illinois because, *inter alia*, the Lockformer Property and Schreiber Home are each located within this District, and Defendants' misconduct, as described more fully below, occurred substantially within this District.

GENERAL ALLEGATIONS OF FACT

Defendants Spilled, Poured and Dumped Thousands of Gallons of Highly Toxic TCE, Which Invaded the Schreiber Family's Water Supply

9. From approximately 1968 until at least 2001, Lockformer used in its manufacturing process a chemical solvent known as Trichlorethylene ("TCE"). The TCE was used to clean parts.

10. TCE is a highly toxic chemical. TCE attacks the body's central nervous system. TCE exposure can cause, among other things, cancer, liver and kidney damage, impaired heart function, impaired fetal development in pregnant woman, convulsions, coma, and death. TCE is identified by the State of Illinois as a cancer causing agent.

11. At all relevant times, Defendants knew or should have known of:

- (a) the highly toxic nature of TCE;
- (b) the fact that TCE should not be spilled, poured, dumped, or otherwise released to the environment; and
- (c) the fact that if TCE were released in any manner to the environment, it should be promptly contained and cleaned up.

12. Despite this knowledge, from approximately 1968 until at least 2001, Defendants spilled, poured, dumped and/or otherwise released thousands of gallons of TCE onto the Lockformer Property.

13. During that time and despite this knowledge, Defendants did nothing to clean up this TCE, to contain it, or in any manner to stop the migration of the TCE through the soil and groundwater.

14. As a result, the TCE spilled, poured, and dumped by the Defendants migrated through the soil on the Lockformer Property – contaminating millions of pounds of this soil – and invading the groundwater flowing beneath the Lockformer Property.

15. The groundwater thus contaminated by TCE at the Lockformer Property was permitted to migrate unimpeded into a community of homes South of, and hydrologically downgradient from, the Lockformer Property, which includes the Schreiber Home. There is no other source of this contamination.

16. During each of the eleven years when Anne lived at the Schreiber Home, Anne and her family received all of the home's water from the family's well, which was drilled into the groundwater contaminated by TCE. Defendants did nothing to test the groundwater serving the homes of the Schreibers or their neighbors; they did nothing to even warn these families that they might be at risk from TCE exposure.

**Because of Her Repeated Contact with the TCE-Contaminated Water
in the Schreiber Home, Anne Has Contracted a Life-Threatening Cancer**

17. During each of these eleven years and continually throughout those years, the water entering the Schreiber Home was contaminated by TCE from the Lockformer Property. However, Anne and her family did not know this. Therefore, Anne used the TCE-contaminated

water for all purposes, including, *inter alia*, showering, bathing, drinking, and preparation of food.

18. In May of 2002, Anne was diagnosed with Non-Hodgkin's Lymphoma (NHL). This was Anne's first notice that she had suffered any personal injury as a result of TCE exposure. NHL is a cancer that attacks the body's immune system. It is extremely rare in women of Anne's age (33), with an incidence in Anne's age group of approximately two in 100,000. The type of NHL which Anne has contracted has no known cure.

19. Anne's NHL was caused by her exposure to water at the Schreiber Home, which was contaminated by TCE due exclusively to Defendants' misconduct. Anne has no known family history or genetic predisposition to NHL, and has not engaged in any activities that have been shown to cause NHL.

20. As a consequence of her having contracted NHL through exposure to TCE-contaminated water from the Lockformer Property:

- (a) Anne has a dramatically shortened life expectancy;
- (b) Anne's ability to practice medicine has been sharply curtailed. For example, since her diagnosis, and for the rest of 2002, Anne has been and will be unable to practice medicine due to the chemotherapy regimen she must undergo;
- (c) Anne has needed, and in the future will need, to undergo extensive and expensive medical testing and treatment;
- (d) Anne has suffered, and will continue to suffer, extreme pain and suffering -- both emotional and physical -- as she endures further testing and treatment, and confronts the devastating impact of NHL on her life;
- (e) Anne's NHL, and treatment for it, have weakened Anne's immune system, rendering her for the rest of her life vulnerable to a host of additional illnesses; and
- (f) Because NHL has no known cure, even if Anne's NHL goes into remission as a result of her current chemotherapy treatment, there will always be a significant likelihood that the NHL will re-occur, and thus Anne will for the rest of her life live with the fear of return of the NHL.

COUNT I

NEGLIGENCE

21. Anne repeats, realleges, and incorporates by reference Paragraph 1 through 20, as though fully set forth herein.

22. At all relevant times, it was the duty of Defendants to exercise a reasonable degree of care for Anne, including, but not limited to:

- (a) to not permit or allow TCE or other hazardous substances to be released into the environment, and to invade the water supply of the Schreiber Home;
- (b) to promptly respond to any releases of TCE or other hazardous substances in a manner sufficient to prevent them from reaching the Schreiber Home; and
- (c) to exercise ordinary care in the use and handling of hazardous substances, including TCE.

23. All Defendants have breached these duties by, inter alia, one or all of the following negligent acts and/or omissions:

- (a) Carelessly and improperly allowing and causing hazardous substances, including TCE, to routinely and frequently be spilled, poured, and dumped onto the soil of the Lockformer Property;
- (b) Failing to establish a procedure for the delivery of TCE to the Lockformer facility that did not result in the release of TCE to the environment;
- (c) Failing to test the Schreiber home for TCE contamination, and failing even to alert the Schreibers to the possibility of TCE contamination;
- (d) Failing to exercise reasonable care and caution in operating and maintaining the Lockformer facility;
- (e) Failing to provide appropriate safe-guards and security measures to prevent, monitor and/or remedy the release of hazardous substances, including TCE, into the environment;
- (f) Carelessly and improperly using a production process which permitted hazardous substances, including TCE, to escape into the environment at the Lockformer Property and to migrate to the Schreiber Home;
- (g) Carelessly and improperly using hazardous substances, including TCE, to clean the floors of the Lockformer facility;
- (h) Carelessly and improperly storing TCE in a tank not equipped with safe-guards to prevent the chemical's discharge, spillage or escape into the environment;
- (i) Carelessly and negligently storing TCE in a tank improperly installed and maintained in a manner which allowed the release, discharge, spillage, or escape of the TCE when Defendants knew or should have known that the improper

- installation and maintenance of this tank would cause such releases to the environment;
- (j) Failing to warn area residents, including the Schreiber family, of the hazardous conditions created by Defendants' release of hazardous substances, including TCE, into the environment;
 - (k) Failing to take reasonable action to contain and clean up the TCE released by Defendants into the environment; and
 - (l) Failing to routinely inspect and/or repair their equipment when they knew or should have known that their equipment was in disrepair, and thus not suitable for any role in the delivery or use of hazardous substances, including TCE.

24. As a direct and proximate result of Defendants' foregoing negligent acts and omissions, hazardous substances, including TCE, migrated from the Lockformer Property to the Schreiber Home and contaminated the water used by the Schreiber family during the period of time that Anne resided there, and routinely used the water. Furthermore, as a direct and proximate result of Defendants' foregoing acts and omissions, Anne has been caused to suffer great personal injury, including having contracted NHL. Anne has suffered severe and permanent, and potentially fatal, injuries; has endured great pain and suffering in both mind and body and will in the future continue to suffer; has been hindered and prevented from her usual and customary duties and affairs and will be so hindered and prevented in the future.

25. Anne has lost and, will continue to lose, considerable income and earnings; has expended and will continue to expend, and become liable for, substantial sums of money for medical care and services while endeavoring to restore her health; and has endured, and will continue to endure, great pain and suffering, both emotionally and physically.

COUNT II

WILFUL AND WANTON MISCONDUCT

26. Anne repeats, realleges and incorporates by reference Paragraphs 1 through 20, as though fully set forth herein.

27. At all relevant times Defendants knew that TCE was not to be spilled, poured or dumped into the environment at the Lockformer Property. At all relevant times, Defendants also knew that, if spilled, poured, or dumped, the TCE was to be immediately contained and/or cleaned-up in order to prevent migration into groundwater systems used by human beings in the area of the Lockformer facility.

28. Furthermore, Defendants knew or should have known of the likelihood that TCE spilled, poured and dumped at the Lockformer Property would invade the drinking water supply of the community of homes to the South, including the Schreiber Home; Defendants also knew that these homes should be tested for TCE contamination, or, at a minimum, that their occupants should be alerted to the possibility of such contamination.

29. Despite this knowledge, and in wilful, wanton and reckless disregard for the safety and health of Anne and her family, Defendants:

- (a) Failed to prevent the spilling, pouring and dumping of TCE and other hazardous substances onto the Lockformer Property;
- (b) Failed to contain or clean up the TCE spilled, poured and dumped onto the Lockformer Property;
- (c) Failed to take any measures whatsoever to prevent the migration of the TCE into the groundwater beneath the Lockformer Property and the groundwater serving the Schreiber Home;
- (d) Failed to test the Schreiber Home for TCE contamination;
- (e) Failed to alert Anne and her family to the likelihood – known by Defendants – that the TCE dumped, poured and spilled had invaded the groundwater used for everyday purposes by Anne and her family; and
- (f) Engaged in the other misconduct set forth above.

30. As a direct and proximate result of the wilful, wanton and reckless acts and/or omissions of the Defendants, Anne came into repeated contact with the TCE-contaminated water and contracted NHL. Furthermore, as a direct and proximate result of Defendants' foregoing acts and omissions, Anne has been caused to suffer great personal injury, including having contracted NHL. Anne has suffered severe and permanent, and potentially fatal, injuries; has

endured great pain and suffering in both mind and body and will in the future continue to suffer; has been hindered and prevented from her usual and customary duties and affairs and will be so hindered and prevented in the future.

31. Anne has lost and, will continue to lose, considerable income and earnings; has expended and will continue to expend, and become liable for, substantial sums of money for medical care and services while endeavoring to restore her health; and has endured, and will continue to endure, great pain and suffering, both emotionally and physically.

WHEREFORE, Plaintiff, ANNE SCHREIBER, respectfully requests that judgment be entered in her favor and against each Defendant for:


- (a) Compensatory damages in excess of \$1 million, in an amount to be determined by jury;




