**FIRST MONTHLY FEE (INTERIM) APPLICATION OF JONES, WALKER
AS COUNSEL TO THE DEBTOR**

NOW INTO COURT, come H Mark Adams and the law firm of Jones, Walker, Waechter, Poitevent, Carrere & Denegre, L L P ("Jones, Walker"), counsel for the debtor, Mississippi Chemical Corporation and its affiliated entities, (the "Debtor"), who make this first monthly fee application for allowance of \$18,669 00 in compensation and \$619 60 in reimbursement of expenses (for a total of \$19,288 60), for the post-petition period through June 30, 2003 (the "Fee Period"), and in support thereof shows as follows

GENERAL BACKGROUND

1

The Debtor previously filed an Application Authorizing Debtors to Retain and Employ Certain Professionals Utilized in the Ordinary Course of Business, including Jones, Walker (the "Application") The Application was granted pursuant to an Order of this Court dated on or about July 1, 2003, subject to certain conditions More particularly, Jones, Walker was retained to continue to assist the Debtor in various ongoing matters, including labor matters, employee benefit advices, and a toxic tort case

By order dated May 16, 2003, this Court entered an Administrative Order Under §§ 105(a) and 331 of the Bankruptcy Code Establishing Procedures for Interim Compensation and Reimbursement of Expenses for Professionals and Official Committee Members (the "Interim Compensation Order"). Pursuant to the terms of the Interim Compensation Order, all professionals whose retention was approved by the Bankruptcy Court (the "Professionals"), including Jones, Walker, are entitled to seek interim payment of their fees and reimbursement of their expenses by forwarding detailed invoices (the "Monthly Fee Application") to the Debtor, Debtor's Counsel, Counsel for Harris Bank, Counsel for Ad Hoc Committee of Noteholders, the United States Trustee, and Counsel to any Official Committee (when and if appointed) (collectively, the "Notice Parties"). The Notice Parties then have fifteen (15) days after service within which to review and serve any objections that they may have upon the respective professional and the other Notice Parties. If no objections are filed, each Professional is to be paid the 80% of the fees and 100% of the expenses in the Monthly Fee Application.

Jones, Walker hereby forwards its Monthly Fee Application in the amount of \$ 18,669.00 in fees and \$619.60 in costs (for a total of \$19,288.60) to the Notice Parties. The fees sought involve five different files as follows:

In *First Colonial Corp* , 544 F 2d 1291 (5th Cir 1977), the court ruled that the twelve (12) factors found in *Johnson v Georgia Highway Express*, 488 F 2d 714 (5th Cir 1974), are considered when awarding compensation. These are set forth below:

- (a) The time and labor required.
- (b) The novelty and difficulty of the question presented.
- (c) The skill required to perform the legal services.
- (d) The preclusions of other employment by attorneys due to acceptance of this case.
- (e) The customary fee in the community.
- (f) Whether the fee is fixed or contingent.
- (g) The time limitations imposed by the client or circumstances.
- (h) The amount involved and the result obtained.
- (i) The experience, reputation and ability of the attorney.
- (j) The undesirability of the case.
- (k) The nature and length of the professional relationship with the client.
- (l) Awards in similar cases.

The *Johnson* factors are identical to those mentioned in 11 U.S.C. § 330(a)(3). Jones, Walker believes that, as applied to Jones, Walker's services here, this Application is appropriate under the *Johnson* factors, as detailed below:


