Dear Messrs. Carey and Phillips:

As you are aware, the U.S. Bankruptcy Court for the District of Maine yesterday issued an order finding that DIRECTV, Inc. has been engaging in violations of the automatic stay imposed by 11 U.S.C. § 362(a) through various activities identified in evidence received in the Court's emergency hearing on Monday.

Under that order, a copy of which is enclosed for your convenience, DIRECTV, Inc. must immediately cease all actions "that are inconsistent with [Pegasus Satellite Television's] ownership of and rights in Subscriber information (as defined under the Member Agreements)." Furthermore, the Court specifically found that Pegasus Satellite Television's rights include "the right to preclude DIRECTV from accessing and utilizing subscriber information in PST files."

Under the Member Agreements, PST's rights run to all information regarding a "Subscriber." Member Agreement § 20(b), as amended. A Subscriber is "any Committed Member Residence . . . which subscribes to "Programming" including specified services and all other information and data transmitted over the DIRECTV Frequencies. Member Agreement §§ 1, 2(a), as amended. As reflected in the DBS Agreement between DIRECTV, Inc. and NRTC, this information includes lists and information (including compilations thereof) regarding Subscribers, Subscriber names and addresses, benefits related to the provision of services to Subscribers and possession of such information, as well as any related commercial or other directories. As DIRECTV Inc. has also recognized, Subscriber information includes zip code

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

information, telephone number, information on services provided to a Subscriber, billing account information, and Subscriber terminal equipment access card number, serial identification number and other information to authorize receipt of programming and data by Subscriber terminal equipment through the Conditional Access Management system.

In spite of the court's order, DIRECTV has continued to violate the automatic stay by transmitting marketing messages targeted to Subscribers on Channel 205 and elsewhere on the DIRECTV satellite system. Such transmission results from DIRECTV, Inc.'s matching of zip code information with activated access card and other Subscriber information to authorize the viewing of such messages through Subscribers' terminal equipment

Unless DIRECTV ceases such activities immediately, Pegasus Satellite Television, Inc. and the related Debtors will move to have it held in contempt of court for violating the automatic stay.

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**ORDER ON DEBTORS' EMERGENCY MOTION FOR RELIEF IN
RESPECT OF VIOLATIONS OF THE AUTOMATIC STAY BY DIRECTV, INC.**

Upon the Emergency Motion for Relief of Violations of the Automatic Stay by DIRECTV, Inc., (the "Motion") of Pegasus Satellite Television, Inc., ("PST") and certain of its subsidiaries and affiliates, each a debtor and debtor-in-possession herein (collectively, the "Debtors"),¹ for entry of an Order finding DIRECTV, Inc. ("DIRECTV") in violation of the automatic stay imposed by 11 U.S.C. § 362(a), and the Court having reviewed the Motion; and having heard the testimony of witnesses and arguments of counsel regarding the relief requested at a hearing before the Court; and finding that the Court has jurisdiction over this matter pursuant to 28 U.S.C. § § 157 and 1334, that this is a core proceeding pursuant to 28 U.S.C. § 157(b)(2), and that notice of the Motion and Hearing was due and proper under the circumstances; and it appearing that granting some part of the relief requested in the Motion is in the best interests of the Debtors, their estates, and their creditors; and good and sufficient cause appearing therefore, it is hereby ORDERED as follows:

1. Certain, limited, action of DIRECTV, Inc., ("DIRECTV") complained of in the Motion and at the hearing thereon from and after the commencement of the above-captioned bankruptcy cases on June 2, 2004, violates the automatic stay imposed by 11 U.S.C. Section 362.

2. More particularly, the automatic stay imposed by Section 362 stays all actions by DIRECTV that are inconsistent with PST's ownership of and rights in Subscriber information (as defined under the Member Agreements); such rights include the right to preclude DIRECTV from accessing and utilizing subscriber information in PST files. Any such action that was taken by DIRECTV after the bankruptcy filing, and any ongoing action of that character, violates the stay.
