County, California. Water District is lessor under an Oil, Gas and Mineral Lease, dated

October 29, 2010, originally between Water District and Maverick Petroleum, Inc., as lessee. A

true and correct copy of the lease is attached as Exhibit "A" to Lisa Holder's Declaration and Exhibits in Support of Berrenda Mesa Water District's Request For Administrative Expense Payment ("Declaration").

- 5. In its schedules filed December 6, 2015, as document no 15, at page 16, Century describes itself as the 100% owner of the Working Interest in "2,334.09 acres, more or less, situated in Secs 19, 20, 29, 30, 31 & 32, , T26S-R20E, M.D.M, and Secs 4 & 36, T26S-R19E, M.D.M., Kern County, California" (hereafter the "Lease"), and describes Water District as the royalty-interest holder of that same property in its Schedule G on page 78 of document no. 15. See Exhibit "B" to the Declaration.
- 6. <u>503(b)(9) claim</u>. During October 06, 2015 through October 25, 2015, within 20 days before Debtor's October 26, 2015, bankruptcy filing, Century extracted oil and gas from the Lease. According to the California Division of Oil, Gas & Geothermal Resources ("DOGGR") printout, included as Exhibit "C" to the Declaration, in October 2015 Century extracted 486 barrels of oil and 800 million cubic feet of gas for which it has not compensated Water District. DOGGR's records do not yet reflect production through January 13, 2016.
- 7. According to information provided through Century's attorney, the unpaid royalty for October 2015 (which would include pre-petition non-priority debt, pre-petition 503(b)(9) priority debt, and post-petition debt) is \$3,510.36. See Exhibit "D" to the Declaration.
- 8. Under Bankruptcy Code section 503(b)(9), allowed administrative expenses include "the value of any goods received by the debtor within 20 days before the date of the commencement of a case under this title in which the goods have been sold to the debtor in the ordinary course of such debtor's business." Oil and gas are "goods." *In re SemCrude, L.P.*, 416 B.R. 399, 405 (Bankr. D. Del. 2009). Century's extracted of oil and gas from the Lease in the ordinary course of its business. *See* Exhibit "C."
- 9. Century alone possesses the records from which the parties and this court can determine what portions of the October 2015 royalties are prepetition-unsecured, prepetition-unsecured-priority, or post-petition debt. Water District requests an opportunity to conduct discovery to obtain Century's records regarding the amount and character of the debt.

10. **503(b)** Claim. Century continued to produce oil and gas from the Lease in October, November, and December 2015, and January 2016, which is post-petition production for which it owes Water District royalties. According to Exhibit "C," in November 2015 (the last month reported to DOGGR) it extracted 130 barrels of oil and 756 million cubic feet of gas. Water District is unable to calculate the debt owed to it by Century because it does not know the rate Century must pay for the oil and gas. Water District requests an opportunity to conduct discovery to obtain Century's records regarding the amount of the debt.

11. Wherefore, Water District prays the court grant its administrative expense claims under section 503(b)(9) claim as may be determined by the court, and under 503(a) as may be determined by the court, and for all other just relief.
