FIRST INTERIM FEE APPLICATION OF BMC GROUP, INC. FOR COMPENSATION AND REIMBURSEMENT OF EXPENSES AS ADMINISTRATIVE AGENT TO THE DEBTORS AND DEBTORS-IN-POSSESSION FOR THE PERIOD SEPTEMBER 6, 2019 THROUGH NOVEMBER 30, 2019

BMC Group Inc. ("BMC Group"), Administrative Agent to the debtors and debtors-in-possession in the above-captioned chapter 11 cases (the "Debtors"), hereby submits its first interim fee application (the "Application") for allowance of interim compensation in the amount of \$24,819.50 and reimbursement of expenses of \$0.00 for the period from September 6, 2019 through and including November 30, 2019 (the "Application Period") pursuant to Sections 330 and 331 of Title 11 of the United States Code (the "Bankruptcy Code"), Rule 2016 of the Federal Rules of Bankruptcy Procedure, Rule 2016-2 of the Local Rules of Bankruptcy Practice and Procedure of the United States Bankruptcy Court for the District of Delaware (the "Local Rules") and the Order Establishing Procedures for Interim Compensation and Reimbursement of Professionals. (the "Interim Compensation Order") [Docket No. 198].

In support of the Application, BMC Group respectfully represents as follows:

## **Background**

- 1. On September 6, 2019 (the "Petition Date"), the Debtors filed voluntary petitions for relief under chapter 11 of the Bankruptcy Code.
- 2. The Debtors continue to operate their businesses and manage their properties as debtors in possession pursuant to Sections 1107(a) and 1108 of the Bankruptcy Code.
- 3. The Court has jurisdiction over this Application pursuant to 28 U.S.C. §§ 157 and 1334. Venue is proper in this district pursuant to 28 U.S.C. §§ 1408 and 1409. This matter is core within the meaning of 28 U.S.C. § 157(b)(2).
- 4. On October 30, 2019, this Court entered an order authorizing the employment and retention of BMC Group as Administrative Agent to the Debtors in the case, *nunc pro tunc* to the Petition Date [Docket No. 327].
- 5. All services for which compensation is requested by BMC Group were performed for or on behalf of the Debtors.
- 6. This is BMC Group's first interim fee application for compensation for services rendered and reimbursement of expenses incurred as Administrative Agent to the Debtors.

### **Summary of Services Rendered**

- 7. In its capacity as Administrative Agent for the Debtors, BMC Group has performed the following services:
  - a) Schedules and SOFA Support:

Services in this category relate to assisting the Debtors in the preparation of the Schedules of Assets and Liabilities, Statement of Financial Affairs, and any amendments thereto, including: 1) assisting the Debtors in gathering the necessary information; 2) logging the files provided by the Debtors to a master index; 3) maintaining a project plan of personnel tasked with providing and verifying the information, and the status of getting that information onto the Schedules and SOFA forms; 4) processing information from the Debtors that is responsive to the questions on the Schedules and SOFAs; 5) verifying the integrity of the information; 6) formatting the information for display on the official forms of the USBC; 7) preparing drafts of the Schedules and SOFAs; 8) reviewing the drafts with the Debtors and counsel to the Debtors to determine necessary revisions, and 9) preparing final forms for filing with the Court.

### **Summary of Expenses**

8. BMC Group expended a total of \$0.00 for reasonable and necessary expenses in connection with its services for the Debtors during the Application Period.

### **Summary of Fees**

9. The total sum due to BMC Group for professional services rendered on behalf of the Debtors for the Interim Compensation Period is \$24,819.50. Attached hereto as <a href="Exhibit A">Exhibit A</a> is a detailed statement of fees incurred as administrative agent during the Interim Compensation Period.

## Valuation of Services

10. In accordance with the factors enumerated in Section 330 of the Bankruptcy Code, the amounts requested herein for compensation and expense reimbursement are fair and reasonable given (a) the complexity of these cases, (b) the time expended by the individual timekeepers at BMC Group, (c) the nature and extent of the services rendered, (d) the value of such services, and (e) the costs of comparable services other than in a case under this title.

11. BMC Group hereby certifies (a) that it has reviewed the requirements of Rule 2016-2 of the Local Rules of Bankruptcy Practice and Procedures and (b) that this Application complies with such rule.

WHEREFORE, pursuant to the Interim Compensation Order, BMC Group respectfully requests that the Court: (a) allow compensation for professional fees and services provided during the Interim Application Period in the amount of \$24,819.50 and reimbursement of actual and necessary expenses incurred during the Interim Application Period in the amount of \$0.00; (b) payment of compensation in total amount of \$19,855.60 (representing 80% of the total fees (\$24,819.50) billed during the Interim Application Period); and (c) such other refiled as this court deems just and proper.
